West Virginia became the first state to officially recognize the day in 1910. President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation creating Mother's Day as a national holiday in 1914.

As Jews, the celebration of Mother's Day always feels a little strange. After all, the fifth of the *Aseret Hadibrot* (Ten Utterances) instructs us to honor our parents every day. Nevertheless, it is always good to create an occasion to perform a mitzvah.

In my family, Mother's Day has some very different overtones. Both my mother and my mother-in-law buried their mothers on the second Sunday in May. In our house the joy of the day is a little more tempered.

Honoring parents is a special mitzvah that doesn't end when our parents leave this earth. It continues on as we carry on their legacy. My parents have taught me well about the performance of this mitzvah. We still speak regularly of my grandparents. I hope I live up to their example and successfully pass it on to my children. May we always treasure our parents and/or their memories.







Letty Cottin Pogrebin is an award-winning journalist, widely published opinion writer, acclaimed public speaker, admired political activist, and author of several nonfiction bestsellers, including *Growing Up Free*; *Getting Over Getting Older*; *Deborah, Golda, and Me*; and *Three Daughters*.
