

GUEST SPEAKER: TRICIA CULLOP

On April 28, 2008, Tricia Cullop came to the University of Toledo with the daunting task of rebuilding a Mid-American Conference powerhouse. Fast forward eight seasons and Cullop and her squads have hung five postseason banners, including a 2011 WNIT championship banner, two MAC regular-season title banners and four West Division banners from the rafters of Savage Arena.

Cullop, who has a 300-197 record in her 15 year coaching career, was named the Toledo head coach in April of 2008, becoming the ninth coach in the program's history.

A native of Bicknell, Indiana, Cullop was a 1989 High School All American at North Knox High School. She was also a member of the North Squad in the 1991 U.S. Sports Festival. She is a 1993 graduate of Purdue University, receiving a bachelor's degree in communications. As a four-year letter winner with the Boilermakers, she was part of three-straight NCAA Tournament teams that won Purdue's first-ever Big Ten championship. Cullop was a team captain in 1992-93 and a three-time championship academic All-Big Ten selection. She was named the Purdue Mortar Board Female Student-Athlete of the Year in 1993.

FROM THE RABBI



No Hallel on Purim?

On most Jewish holidays we recite Hallel, special chapters from Psalms, as a means of praising Hashem. Hallel is conspicuously absent from the Purim service, and the Rabbis of the Talmud discuss the reason. One thought is that the reading of the Megillah takes the place of Hallel. The other reason is a little more complicated.

If we examine most of the reasons that we celebrate holidays we see a definitive result. For example, Passover commemorates that we were slaves to Pharaoh and now Hashem has made us free. The Purim story is different. We begin under Persian rule, and we end under Persian rule. We survive the decree of the evil Haman, but at the end we are not significantly changed from where we were at the beginning.

Purim is certainly not insignificant in the context of Jewish history. As a result of the events contained in the Megillah we are ultimately able to return to Israel and rebuild the Beit Hamidash. Unfortunately, however, this was not a full return. A relatively small percentage went back to the land, and we remained under the dominion of others.

I wish one and all a happy and healthy Purim, but let us always remember that the challenges of our ancestors are ongoing.

FROM THE PRESIDENT



Last month in my report I mentioned that changes in our synagogue would be occurring. At the January meeting of the Board of Trustees, a recommendation came forth from the Long Range Planning Committee with input from the Finance Committee. Beginning February 1, 2017 the synagogue has new office hours. Monday through Thursday the office will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and it will be closed on Friday. Lunch hour will be from 11:45 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. This change was made to meet our budgetary challenges and will save us

approximately \$17,000 per fiscal year. It doesn't alleviate our entire deficit, but it is helpful. Additional changes will be announced as they are formulated.

We will continue to maintain as many of our programs and services as possible. To maximize our efforts, we need more volunteer help. How can you help out? Call the office and let them know if you can volunteer on a specific day and time.

Many of the cuts being made are due to members being in arrears with their dues and financial commitments. PAYING on your account would be helpful. Sponsor an activity such as a kiddush or a Shabbat dinner.

In my installation speech, I spoke to the concept that our synagogue will only be effective if we treat it with a village approach. We need each of us to make a difference. I welcome you to help make that difference.


Currently Carol is chairing the Sisterhood Shaloch Manos Purim Fundraiser.




