No Rest For the Weary

During the month of December we read the final five portions in the book of Genesis which contain a large portion of the life of our forefather Jacob. Of all of our patriarchs Jacob seems to have the most troubled life. His continued resilience teaches us as Jews all we need to survive.

Jacob's trials begin in the womb, fighting with his twin brother Esau. The two battle before birth, during birth, as children, and as adults. Ultimately, Jacob has to leave his home to escape the wrath of Esau.

Jacob flees to his uncle Laban, but his misfortunes only continue. Laban cheats Jacob every way possible, from changing brides to shady business dealings. Despite all of this, the Tribes of Israel are born and Jacob amasses significant wealth.

Upon travelling back to his homeland, Jacob lands in Shechem. The prince decides that he wants Jacob's daughter by any means necessary. This is just the next episode causing heartache to our great ancestor.

Finally arriving back at his family's abode, Jacob's life takes its final left turn with the episode of Joseph. The favorite son is sold into slavery and descends to Egypt, separated from his father for decades. They do reunite before each dies, but the next generation begins the saga of Egyptian slavery.

The life of Jacob is a microcosm of Jewish history. Four thousand years is filled with trials and tribulations. When all is said and done, however, the bottom line is that we are still here to tell the story. Despite all, we survive and thrive.

May we the Jews of 5778 continue to live by the example of our forefather Jacob. There is no challenge we cannot meet.


