



Shavuot and Dairy



Shavuot is an unusual holiday in that there is no specific ritual or mitzvah that applies only to Shavuot. We don't have anything like a seder or a succah on this Yom Tov. We do, however, have customs unique to Shavuot.

On Shavuot we celebrate the giving of the Torah on Mt. Sinai. With that revelation came 613 commandments. Among those obligations were many laws regarding the preparation of meat. Suffice it to say the Torah gave us numerous steps to get from live cow to prime rib. These new laws were more than a little daunting, causing our ancestors to fall back on the much simpler preparation of dairy.

This year we have the privilege of coordinating our Sisterhood's closing luncheon with the holiday of Shavuot. Following services on the first day of the holiday we are all invited to join in a traditional dairy meal in the Louis and Dora Cohen Auditorium. At that time the sisterhood will install its new board and present its Woman of the Year Award to Mrs. Carol VanZile, a very deserving recipient.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

FREEDOM!! How does one define freedom? Are there incidents from our personal lives that suggest freedom to each of us? As we sat around the Seder table thinking about these concepts, everyone was allowed to share an experience they had that embraced the concept of freedom. My daughter Marla, who led the Seder, presented this discussion. The beauty of the evening was that we heard comments from three different generations. From the very young to our senior members, each guest was encouraged to share.



Several comments were related to events of peaceful demonstrations such as being able to be a part of the "March of our Lives." One of our guests was in Washington D.C., while another walked in Columbus, Ohio. Three of our guests, two different generations, remembered their "Walk to the Summit for Soviet Jews in 1987." Most shared the regret that we take so many of our freedoms for granted, i.e. education, medical choices, owning a library card. Women have rights today they didn't have a century ago, and some even more recently. We recognize the fact that in many parts of the world women still lack equal rights.

We may practice any religion we wish to practice. We have the freedom of having enough food to sustain us. In fact, we learned that more people in the U.S. die from overeating than from starvation. And, through our discussions, we were reminded that so many people are born into environments that restrict their freedoms. Gang members, people suffering from poverty, find it almost impossible to escape the worlds they know.

And we shared that with all of our freedoms, we also share the responsibility to help others who need our assistance to escape their difficult worlds. Passover always reminds us of the difficult roads our ancestors traveled. Maybe, it also tells us that we should not take our freedoms for granted and that we should be so grateful for what we all have.

Passover – a feast of remembrance - and certainly food for continued thought.



Our speaker will be native Toledoan Edward Krauss, author of the book *Solomon the Accountant*. Ed will review his book and prepare a reading from a selection in the book.

Ed was born and raised in Toledo and has lived in Columbus for the past thirty-five years. He is a mediator who focuses on personnel, employment, and financial conflicts. Ed has mediated many Equal Employment Opportunity disputes for the United States Postal Service and numerous personnel disputes for government agencies. He has also mediated a wide variety of financial matters.

Ed is the author of three novels: *Solomon The Accountant*, a gentle love story set in Toledo's middle-class Jewish community in 1950; *Here On Moon*, a story of deceit, divorce, and recovery; and *A Story Of Bad*, two stories wound together - a murder mystery and a love story. Ed is also the co-author of *On Being The Boss*, a book about effective crisis management and the U.S. Constitution's application in the workplace.

About Solomon The Accountant:

Solomon has fallen hard for a young, recent widow, Molly Manion. He gently, tenderly tries to win her heart as she struggles with leaving behind her old love and accepting new love, all the while tugged and pulled by her family and society's expectations.

Herman Moskaivitch is Solomon's best friend. Herman's almost-engaged relationship with Deborah Goldman is becoming strained; Deborah is interested in marriage, Herman isn't ready to propose.

Solomon becomes involved in the Herman and Deborah situation; meanwhile Herman and then Deborah support Solomon in his pursuit of Molly. *Solomon the Accountant* is a warm-hearted, character-driven story of love lost and found, strong friendships and family bonds, told with tears and laughter.

Dani Dayan officially assumed the post of Consul General of Israel in New York as of August 2016. As Consul General, he represents the State of Israel to communities from throughout New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Delaware.

Amb. Dayan has a long time reputation as an Israeli public figure, lecturer and entrepreneur enjoying wide support and appreciation from all sides of the Israeli political spectrum. His nomination by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, was publicly welcomed by the Israeli opposition too.

Dayan was Chairman of the Council of Jewish Communities in Judea and Samaria from July 2007 until January 2013. He was instrumental in pushing through multiple reforms and policy changes to strengthen the image of the organization and advocate on behalf of its 400,000 citizens. He then acted for two additional years as the Council's Chief Foreign Envoy. His role included advocacy trips to the major seats of government worldwide as well as regular meetings with foreign diplomats and journalists based in Israel to explain the facts on the ground.

Amb. Dayan has been for many years a regular commentator in the international press, both broadcast and

print and was frequently called upon to participate in public debates and panels at major conferences and universities. Among the media outlets he contributed to are New York Times, Boston Globe, The Guardian, CNN, BBC, Al Jazeera and many more.

Before establishing his own information technology company Dayan spent seven and a half years in the Israel Defense Forces serving in the elite MAMRAM computerized data processing center, attaining the rank of Major.

Dayan holds a B.Sc. in Economics and Computer Sciences from Bar Ilan University and M.Sc. in Finance from Tel Aviv University. He is fluent in Hebrew, English and Spanish. He also served on the Israel Broadcasting Authority Board and the Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial Council. Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1955, Dayan immigrated to Israel in 1971. He resides with his wife and daughter in the community of Maale Shomron in central Samaria.
