ETZ CHAYIM SISTERHOOD CHANUKAH RECIPES

ZUCCHINI LATKES

Rochelle Black

5 medium zucchini
1 large onion
3 eggs
1/3 c. flour

1 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
3/4 c. oil for frying

Finely grate the zucchini on a grater or in a food processor. Grate the onion and combine with the zucchini. Squeeze out the excess water & save for later.

Add the eggs, flour, salt & pepper to the zucchini/onion mixture & mix well. Heat 1/2 c. oil in a skillet until hot & sizzling. Lower the flame & drop by tablespoons into oil & fry for approximately 5 minutes until golden. Turn over & continue frying for approximately 2-3 minutes using extra oil if necessary. Drain on paper towels. (Use the reserved liquid if the consistency becomes too thick.

HOMEMADE APPLESAUCE **Elsa Leveton (via Sandy Marcus)**

3 lbs. Gala apples
3 lbs. Fuji apples
4 cinnamon sticks

Peel, core & slice the apples into 1/4" slices. In a large pot, add about 1/4 inch of water or enough to cover the bottom. Put the apples and cinnamon sticks in the pot with the cinnamon sticks full immersed within the apples. Cover the pot and cook over low to medium heat until apples are soft. Let cool and then puree with an immersion blender or food processor or mash until you have the consistency you desire.

BAKED APPLE CIDER DONUTS **Andrea Lublin**

1 1/2 c. all purpose flour	1/2 c. brown sugar, lightly packed
1 1/2 tsp. baking powder	1/2 c. granulated sugar
1 tsp. salt	2 large eggs
1 tsp. cinnamon	1/3 c. apple cider
1/4 tsp. nutmeg (freshly ground, if possible)	1/4 c. buttermilk (or 1/4 c. whole milk mixed with 1 T. apple cider vinegar to curdle it)
Zest of 1 lemon	1 tsp. vanilla
1 stick unsalted butter, softened	

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray donut pans (or muffin tins) with baking spray.

In a medium size bowl, combine flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg & lemon zest.

In the bowl of a standard mixer, fixed with a paddle, combine the butter, brown sugar & granulated sugar. Mix on high until light and fluffy, 3-4 minutes.

Add the eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Add the cider, buttermilk (or curdled milk) & vanilla.

Turn the mixer to low speed & add the flour mixture until well combined. Pipe or spoon the mixture into the donut or muffin tins to 2/3 full. Bake until the donuts spring back, about 10-14 minutes. When done, loosen each donut carefully with a knife & turn out onto a wire rack.

Lightly brush with some melted butter & dip into a mixture of 1/2 c. sugar & 1 tsp cinnamon.

Chanukah Candle-Lighting

The first two blessings are said with the Shamash already lit, but immediately prior to lighting the Chanukah candles.

This paragraph is said each night, after the first light has been kindled.
