

FROM THE RABBI

As we move into September, we find ourselves in the month of Elul with Rosh Hashanah and our other High Holy Days quickly approaching. Yet Elul actually has a 'Rosh Hashanah' of its own!

Rosh Hodesh Elul, the new moon festival of the month of Elul, marks Rosh Hashanah La'Behemot (The New Year for animals.) In the times of the Temple, Rosh Hashanah La'Behemot marked a day of counting domesticated animals for tithing purposes and parallels the more well-known Rosh Hashanah of the tree (Tu B'shvat), the New Year's Festival that marked the day for tithing fruit-bearing trees.

In the millenia after the Temple's destruction, TuB'shvat was re-established by mystics as a special day of *tikkun* (spiritual repair) - a day to reflect on and pray for healing our relationship with trees and, by extension, the whole of life-nurturing Earth. In this spirit, perhaps we can transform this Rosh Hashanah La'Behemot into a moment where we can reflect on our relationship with the animal world.

Rabbinic sources dating back to Nachmanides in 13th century Spain talk extensively about how every living thing, including animals, have souls. The proof he offers for this claim is the obvious love that dogs have for their owners. That love and familiarity is the strongest proof of a soul, the spark of the Divine that exists in all things. We therefore have an obligation to honor that love, as well as the Souls of all animals.

This New Year's Day for Animals, I encourage us to reflect on our relationships to the animals who depend on us for their welfare, including those beyond our homes, and recognize our personal responsibilities to them individually and as part of a distinct and holy people, and repair our relationships to the best of our ability.

We are excited to hold Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur services in person this year in our beautiful sanctuary. In light of the current situation relating to the Covid-19, we are limiting attendance to vaccinated members and their guests ONLY. Proof of vaccination will be required to attend services. 
