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FROM THE PRESIDENT

FREE AT LAST...Now what?

We all just finished the Passover holiday, celebrating our journey from slavery to freedom. Now it is time for the counting of the Omer and the coming of Shavuot. I must admit that I have not been totally clear on how our new-found freedom, counting the Omer, and receiving the Torah are tied together. So naturally, I googled "counting of the Omer" and found an enlightening article authored by the late Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. The article's title is "Counting Time" and it brought perspective and clarity closer for me.

While the scope of the article is much greater, Rabbi Sacks offers explanations in terms of cyclical time and historical time.

Here are some excerpts:

If we look at festivals of the Bible - Pesach, Shavuot and Succot - we see that each has a dual logic. On the one hand, they belong to cyclical time. They celebrate seasons of the year - Pesach is the festival of spring, Shavuot of first fruits, and Succot of the autumn harvest...

However, they also belong to [historical] time. They commemorate historic events. Pesach celebrates the exodus from Egypt, Shavuot the giving of the Torah...It follows that the counting of the Omer also has two temporal dimensions.

On the one hand, it belongs to cyclical time. The 49 days represent the period of the grain harvest, the time during which farmers had most to thank G-d for - for "bringing forth bread from the ground." Thus understood, each day of the counting is a separate religious act...

...But the Omer is also part of historical time. It represents the journey from Egypt to Sinai, from exodus to revelation.

In terms of freedom, the Rabbi writes:

Chofesh is the freedom a slave acquires when he no longer has a master. It means that there is no one to tell you what to do. You are master of your own time.

This kind of freedom alone, however, cannot be the basis of a free society. If everyone is free to do what they like, the result will be freedom for the strong, but not the weak, the rich, but not the poor... A free society requires restraint and the rule of law. There is such a thing as a constitution of liberty. That is what the Israelites acquired at Mt. Sinai in the form of the covenant.

A GIFT FROM OUR HERITAGE TO OUR PROGENY

It was our enormous privilege, in the fall of 2022, on behalf of Congregation Etz Chayim, to deliver 168 Yiddish books from the Etz Chayim Library to the Yiddish Book Center, located in Amherst, Massachusetts.

Following is an excerpt from the note of appreciation our congregation received for this donation:

The significance of the books and other Yiddish materials we have recovered with the help of generous donors like you cannot be overstated. They represent the primary, tangible legacy of a millennium of Jewish life in Eastern Europe. We work not only to preserve the books, but to open them up to the world by advancing knowledge of their content, context, and literary and cultural progeny. We offer fellowships and courses in Yiddish language and Jewish culture for high school students, college students and adults; we're training a new generation of translators of Yiddish literature into English; we record oral histories and contemporary stories; we host the annual Yidstock Festival of New Yiddish Music. After three decades, we've emerged as one of the world's largest, liveliest, and most original Jewish organizations.

To learn about the development of this amazing institution, we recommend reading *Outwitting History*, by the Center's founder, Aaron Lansky. For more information about the Center, visit their website, yiddishbookcenter.org.

It is important to recognize that these books came from synagogue and community members, donated to our library through the years, for perpetuity. This donation is consistent with that goal.

We appreciate greatly the invaluable assistance we received from Alice Applebaum in culling these books from the Etz Chayim Library.



SHAVUOT



It is ironic that Shavuot is such a little-known holiday, given that it commemorates the single most important event in Jewish history – the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai.

Shavuot occurs on the 6th of Sivan, the culmination of a seven-week period, "counting of the Omer," that occurs following Passover. The very name "Shavuot" means "weeks," in recognition of the weeks of preparation and anticipation leading up to the Sinai experience. Since Shavuot occurs 50 days after the first day of Passover, it is sometimes known as "Pentecost," a Greek word meaning "the holiday of 50 days." (Shavuot, however, has no connection to the Christian Pentecost holiday.)

Three millennia ago, after leaving Egypt on the day of Passover, the Jews traveled into the Sinai desert. There, the entire Jewish nation – 3 million men, women and children – directly experienced divine revelation:

G-d spoke to you from the midst of the fire; you were hearing the sound of words, but you were not seeing a form, only a sound. He told you of His covenant, instructing you to keep the Ten Commandments, and He inscribed them on two stone tablets. (Deut. 4:12-13)

The giving of the Torah was an event of awesome proportions that indelibly stamped the Jewish nation with a unique character, faith and destiny. And in the 3,300 years since, the Torah's ideals – monotheism, justice, responsibility – have become the moral basis for Western civilization. In the words of U.S. President Calvin Coolidge, "The Hebraic mortars cemented the foundations of American democracy."

Shavuot this year begins at sundown on Thursday, May 25 and ends at nightfall on Saturday, May 27.




