TISHA B'AV

Tisha B'Av, the Fast of the Ninth of Av, is a day of mourning to commemorate the many tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people, many of which have occurred on the ninth of Av. Tisha B'Av means "the ninth (day) of Av". This year it falls on Wednesday evening/Thursday, July 26 & 27, 2023.



Although this holiday is primarily meant to commemorate the destruction of the Temple, it is appropriate to consider on this day the many other tragedies of the Jewish people, many of which occurred on this day, most notably the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and from England in 1290.

Tisha B'Av is the culmination of a three week period of increasing mourning, beginning with the fast of the 17th of Tammuz, which commemorates the first breach in the walls of Jerusalem, before the First Temple was destroyed. During this three week period, weddings and other parties are not permitted, and people refrain from cutting their hair. From the first to the ninth of Av, it is customary to refrain from eating meat or drinking wine (except on the Shabbat) and from wearing new clothing.

The restrictions on Tisha B'Av are similar to those on Yom Kippur: to refrain from eating and drinking (even water); washing, bathing, shaving or wearing cosmetics; wearing leather shoes; engaging in sexual relations; and studying Torah. Work in the ordinary sense of the work (rather than the Shabbat sense) is also restricted. People who are ill need not fast on this day. Many of the traditional mourning practices are observed: people refrain from smiles, laughter and idle conversation, and sit on low stools.

In the synagogue, the Book of Lamentations is read and mourning prayers are recited. Tisha B'Av is never observed on Shabbat. If the 9th of Av falls on a Saturday, the fast is postponed until the 10th of Av.

TOLEDO JEWISH COMMUNITY HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BUILD DAYS

On Wednesday, June 7 and Wednesday, June 28 the Jewish community will be partnering with the Baha'i community on an interfaith Habitat for Humanity build, Phase I (Rough Framing) & Phase 2 (Interior Finish). Four to six volunteers will be needed for each day. The Baha'i community has generously offered to provide lunch on both dates for all volunteers.

In addition, please mark your calendars for Thursday, July 6 for a Toledo Jewish Community Habitat For Humanity Build Day sponsored by Congregation Etz Chayim, Congregation B'nai Israel, Temple Shomer Emunim, and the Jewish Federation of Greater Toledo. This day will be exclusive to the Toledo Jewish community and will be Phase III (Final Finishes) of the build. A total of up to eight volunteers will be needed.



All builds take place from 8:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. at 5707 Clover Lane, Toledo.

Volunteers do not have to have any building experience!
